Layout

1. Springer has a Latex macro that may be used. Macros may be retrieved from this link: <https://www.springer.com/gp/authors-editors/book-authors-editors/manuscript-preparation/5636> and click on 'LaTeX template' and 'contributed books'.

It is the authors' choice whether to use the macro or not. If not used, Springer will be happy to implement the macro upon submission of the final files for each volume. Should you choose not to use the macro, please be advised that the `\textwidth` should use approximately 4.75 inches only. I mention this in case you have equations that run more than this length.

2. In an effort to publish a somewhat unified presentation, kindly use the following guidelines in your layout. The attached Sample chapter pages.pdf includes the proper order in which Abstract, Key Words, MSC codes, should appear. It also shows the preferred style of references, citations, and running heads. It does not show the preferred style of chapter title.

Chapter title: Use upper and lowercase

Affiliations: Include all affiliations and email addresses for each author. Please indicate corresponding author.

Abstract: Include an abstract, but one which is perhaps limited to 8 lines of text.

Key Word and Phrases: This is always helpful; especially where Search Engine Optimization (SEO) is concerned.

Mathematics Subject Classification (2010): These may be obtained from the following site: <http://www.ams.org/mathscinet/msc/msc2010.html>

Inclusion of MSC codes is particularly useful to MathReview and Zentralblatt for indexing and abstracting purposes.

Acknowledgements: Including any mention of grant support funding should be relegated to the end of the paper just before the References. `\vspace*{1in} {\bf Acknowledgements.} XXXXX`

References: No doubt, each paper will reflect the use of a different reference and citation style. These differentiations from paper-to-paper will be retained. In other words, Springer will not change your reference or citation styles. However, we prefer numbered and alphabetical references with corresponding citation styles. See SampleChapter.pdf.

Page proofs

3. Let us assume that the Author who signs the CTP form, mentioned in point 4 below, will be the person who will receive and review the page proofs for your paper. Naturally, this 'corresponding' Author is welcome to share page proofs with his/her co-author(s). Once the entire volume enters the Production stage, the compositor will send you an estimated date for which page proofs will become available to you. I note here that this estimated date may change, in which case you should be notified well in advance of a new date.

Legal Matters

4. Attached please find Springer CTP form. Only one author for each contribution needs to sign this transfer of copyright agreement. The easiest method is to print the form, fill in the name of the paper, names of all authors, and one signature + date is needed. (Kindly then print the name of the signing Author so that we may understand who is the one to receive page proofs mentioned in Point #3.) Scan or mail the document and send to me at Elizabeth.loew@springer.com . Thank you!

Any permission needed for use of figures/graphics must be obtained by the Author(s).

The final publication

5. Per the Agreement that Springer has with the volume editors, each corresponding author (1 per chapter) will receive a print copy of the book once published. To facilitate the shipping of these complimentary copies, kindly ensure that you provide to me the preferred shipping address + phone number. This address may be indicated on the Springer CTP form mentioned in point #4 above. For some reason, we have better luck shipping to home addresses than we do to Universities. However, should you wish to receive your books at your University, please send a full address which includes a building and/or street number – no PO Box numbers, please, also phone number, email address, etc.
